Too sick for school?

Nearly all children get sick from time to time. Sending a sick child to school may make the child more miserable and spread a contagious illness to classmates. The following guidelines will help parents decide whether their child is too sick for school.

Fever is an important symptom, especially if it occurs along with a sore throat, nausea or a rash. Fevers are ok because the higher body temperature is a result of the immune system working so the body can heal. Children with a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher should stay home. Your child should be fever-free 24 hours (without medication) before returning to school. Remember to follow the directions for your thermometer.

Diarrhea and vomiting make children very uncomfortable. Keep your child home until the illness is over, and for 24 hours after the last episode (without medicine).

Strep throat is highly contagious and the child may complain of a sudden sore throat and fever and often stomachache and headache. The child may return to school 24 hours after the antibiotic treatment begins and if no fever.

Pinkeye or conjunctivitis is highly contagious and uncomfortable. Symptoms include eyes burning, itching and a cloudy or yellow discharge from the eye. Child should stay home until doctor recommends your child return to school. Medication may be prescribed.

Flu/Influenza symptoms include body aches, high fever, chills, congestion, sore throat and in some children vomiting. These symptoms usually come on very quickly! Rest and *sometimes* medication is prescribed.

Respiratory viruses (flu, covid, RSV): The IDPH guidelines are that you can go back to your normal activities when, for at least 24 hours, both are true:

- Your symptoms are getting better overall, **and**
- You have not had a fever (and are not using fever-reducing medication).
- When you go back to your normal activities, take added precaution over the next 5 days, such as taking additional steps for cleaner air, hygiene, masks, physical distancing, and/or testing when you will be around other people indoors. This is especially important to protect people with factors that increase their risk of severe illness from respiratory viruses.

Frequent hand washing is one of the best ways to prevent the spread of infection. Please encourage frequent hand washing at home and at school.

If your child needs to stay home due to illness or other reasons, please call the school. For safety, we need to know why your child is not at school. Remember to always make sure that the school knows how to reach you during the day and that there is a back-up plan and phone number if we cannot reach you.

Dear parents/guardians:

I am sending out a friendly reminder that we have multiple students between the elementary building and middle school/high school building that have severe allergies to peanuts and tree nuts. To keep all students safe we need to keep both buildings a nut free zone. Please do not send anything containing peanuts or tree nuts to school with your child; this includes cold lunches and snacks. **This means NO peanut butter, peanuts, cashews, almonds, pecans, walnuts, pistachios, or anything containing any of these nuts.** If you are unsure if something contains a nut please don't bring it to school. Our kitchen staff has already eliminated all nuts from both buildings. The vending machine at the middle school/high school has also eliminated products for purchase that contain nuts. If you have any questions please feel free to contact me.
